Hello, Fellow Board Members,

My name is Mckenzie Augare, and I will be teaching at the Babb Elementary School for the upcoming school year, 2025-26. Having served 5 years at Browning Elementary, I have seen the positive impact of professional help on our students' mental health. The trauma our children on our Reservation have experienced from birth and continue to experience is a serious issue that needs to be addressed. I am requesting approval to bring professional help by identifying social-emotional concerns, which will significantly benefit our students.

While we currently have the DESSA program in place to identify behavior, I believe we can further enhance our support system. In partnering with the National Center for Rural Schools Mental Health to develop comprehensive tools, student surveys, interventions, and professional development material is a testament to the potential of such initiatives. Just as behavior is important, so is mental health. I am confident that this opportunity can significantly improve mental health and provide teachers with successful ways to help and support their students. I have attached a picture that includes some information about this project.

Study Timeline:

Summer 2025

May-August - EIS orientation and developing readiness (one meeting, arranged at school's convenience)

August-Sept 2025

August –Team planning for EIS and survey data collection September – Parent opt out information sent home by school

Early to Mid-October 2025

October -- Universal screener completed by teachers (grades k-12) and students (grades 3-12)

October - Climate survey completed by students (grades 3-12, can administer when student do screener)

October - Principals and teachers complete brief anonymous study survey (takes 15 minutes).

October – Intervention schools get EIS reports and school climate reports AND consultation on using data October—Control schools get school climate report and list of students with elevated internalizing problems

Monthly consultation for Intervention schools:

November, December, January, February, March, April -monthly consultation for intervention schools
