Committee Reports

Facilities- James Moon, Jeff Stauder, and Dr. Lett provided an overview of the meeting held on 12.4.24. They discussed the best option for Washington and Lincoln School was demolition. During this meeting the committee decided upon auctioning off the contents of the schools they will be using Price-Spracklen to help complete this task. There was also discussion about purchasing the old Walmart building with the partnering of the City. <u>Curriculum</u>-Mr. Donahue, Mr. McDonald, and Kyle Anderson provided an overview of the meeting held on 12.09.24.Mr. McDonald went into detail about what the changes mean for the students, they will be able to choose courses that interest them and are relevant to their future goals. This change will start with the incoming freshman class.

Motion to accept the H.S. Course Guide Changes for 2025-2026 and the recommendation to phase out Valedictorian and Salutatorian recognitions and replace those with Latin Honors Recognition at the conclusion of the 2027-2028 School Year. Motion was made by Hadowsky and seconded by Moon. Motion was approved.

Administrative Reports

<u>Principals</u>: All three of our principals were present and provided an update from each of their buildings.

<u>PHS</u>: Kevin McDonald explained how the High School is partnering with OKAW. They have submitted a College and Career Pathway Endorsement plan that will allow next year's juniors to enter into a two year program at OKAW to earn a Career Pathway Endorsement and 13 college credits specific to education. The four classes will transfer as ED 100, 101, 216 and 224.

<u>Jr High:</u> Lisa Mayhall talked about how their SIP Day teachers participated in the Thanksgiving Escape Room created by Ashley Keeling. Each Team had to work together and complete four different tasks. They had a ton of fun in doing this, great student teacher interaction!

<u>PES</u>: Adam Metzger expressed how great their Music and Art event went in November. This was something new they tried instead of doing it after school hours, it allowed for all students to attend. They had a great turn out!

Athletic Director: Stile Smith provided highlights on our fall sports, as well as gave a preview/comment on the upcoming winter sports.

<u>Buildings and Transportation:</u> Jeff Stauder provided updates on each school and the projects going on. He also made a recommendation for the district to sell the 3 buses and a forklift.

Motion to approve the Resolution Authorizing the Sale of Two School Buses, One Minibus, and One Forklift That is Property of the Board of Education of Pana Community Unit School District No. 8.Motion was made by Moon and seconded by Blackwell Motion was approved.

<u>Curriculum and Instruction</u>-Paul Donahue informed us that the preparation for state testing in the spring is underway. He also touched on some of the changes that will be happening in how each school will test.

Superintendent

<u>Tax Levy-</u>Dr. Lett explained_Last month we provided in-depth analysis of the levy request. In summary we are recommending an overall levy increase of 13% from the previous year. Despite this aggressive increase the overall rate is not projected to increase 4.79 (2024 Est.) vs. 4.80 (2023 Actual).

Motion to approve the District's 2024 Tax Levy. Motion was made by Hadowsky and seconded by Moon. Motion was approved.

Resolution abating the taxes heretofore levied for the year 2024 to pay debt service on the General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2019, and General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2023, of Community Unit School District Number 8, Christian, Shelby and Montgomery Counties, Illinois -Dr. Lett Spoke on this topic and explained Passage of this resolution is now an annual procedural step needed to be taken by the Board until the alternative revenue bond principal and interest is paid off. The 1% sales tax revenue has been pledged to make our annual bond payments for the PES project

Motion to approve the resolution(s) abating taxes heretofore levied for the year 2024 to pay debt service on the General Obligation School Bonds (Alternative Revenue Source), Series 2019, and General Obligation School Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source), Series 2023, of Community Unit School District Number 8, Christian, Shelby and Montgomery Counties, Illinois. A motion was made by Blackwell and seconded by Moon. Motion was approved.
