Teaching, Learning & Relevance

- Work on identifying post-high school readiness indicators in the areas of Career and Life has continued. (Redefining Ready). In the coming months, the Building Leadership Team will begin reviewing the selections and discuss how the development of these indicators can be supported by various programming.
- The PreACT was administered for the first time on April 19th and the Forward Exam took place over the course of two days, April 18th and the 20th. There was extensive training and preparation that took place in order to run a successful assessment environment. Test administration ran smoothly and observations were noted for next year.
- The Spring Benchmark FastBridge Assessment window is May 1st through May 12th. The ELA, Math, and Special Education departments have analyzed the data from previous benchmark assessments to determine both Tier 2 and 3 interventions in order to respond to student needs.
- 4/14 Chamber Choir Tenor and Bass students attended the Northwoods Tenor–Bass Fest at Northland Pines High School. Nearly all of the THS Chamber Choir students were a part of the eighty plus singers in attendance.
