How many events/productions does your group offer to the children annually?

- 3 school year musical productions
 28 total shows plus community performances
 - 7/8th grade only show (Fall) 6 shows
 - 6th grade only show (Winter) 3 shows
 - All school show (Spring) 8 shows
- 3 summer shows for 4-8th graders
 - Jr. Bravo Academy (JBA) 4-6th grade production 3 shows
 - Bravo Academy (BA) 6-8th grade productions 8 shows




How many children participate in your offerings annually?

What is the practice/meeting schedule for the students?

- Show rehearsals 3:30-6p Monday to Friday and select Saturdays amount each child attends varies by role
 - Amount of rehearsal also depends on the show 6th graders rehearse less
 - Total number of rehearsal hours ranges from 125 to 200 per show
 - Rehearsal process for each show is ~8 weeks
- Stage crew starts ~3-4 weeks before show performances
- Dance Studio, Crew Club and Guitar Club run throughout the year after school, with occasional performances
 - Dance Studio one or two days a week, students choice, 3:30-4:30p
 - Guitar one day a week, 3:30 5:00p
 - Crew Club twice a month, 3:30-5:30p

What efforts are made by the organization to be inclusive and recruit children who may not initiate joining the activity on their own?

- Reach out to the student community by **visiting classrooms** and the Commons **lunchroom** to encourage them to participate and ask questions
- Work with teachers, social workers, assistant principals to identify students who could benefit from BRAVO activities & community-building
- Continue to provide **no-audition opportunities**
- Recruit students recommended by other students one-on-one







How do Special Education children become involved?

- Special Education (SPED) children are welcome to perform in any BRAVO production, at any time, with no audition; rehearsals are kept to a minimum
- BRAVO reaches out to SPED staff several times a year and have direct contact with GBMS Multi-Needs Teacher Lynne Beauprez and SPED teachers
- BRAVO holds a full-day annual InSPirED workshop specifically for children of all abilities and ages districtwide to enjoy musical and experience musical theater

The BRAVO program supports students with social emotional, intellectual, behavioral, and physical disabilities by working with special education teachers and teacher assistants to find the best way for all students to be involved. The InSPirED workshop that BRAVO sponsors gives our students with significant disabilities an outlet to express the joys of singing, dancing and entertaining with peers. The BRAVO staff has a "can-do" attitude while working with special education teaching staff to ensure the successful participation of all students with a desire to perform.

Belonging is everything to kids - we are proud to be a safe and supportive learning environment for all at GBMS

- Socially Sense of family, lifelong friendships supportive, encouraging environment, accepting of differences. For many students, this is the place where kids feel welcome, accepted and loved unconditionally.
- **Emotionally** BRAVO staff support the students and their families through schedule-juggling, academic support, and social issues like friend dynamics, anxiety and gender identity; work closely with GBMS social workers; alumni return to mentor, assist and continue to grow
- Academically Downtime work on homework along with peers; GBMS graduates assist at Homework Help tables and to tutor during extended weeks
- Time Management students learn to balance commitments to schoolwork, family, BRAVO, and other activities - a lifelong skill
- It's Not About the Role, It's About the Goal
 - BRAVO performances are TEAM sports no small parts, each student plays a part in making the show amazing
 - Show requires that everyone works together cast, dance corp., ensemble, crew, staff, volunteers, audience
 - End result is Broadway-caliber, quality production and experience that the students are always very proud of

K-5 Students - BRAVO touches nearly every K-5 student in the four schools that feed to GBMS (Whittier, Holmes, Hatch, Lincoln) and many others:

- BRAVO Abroad takes **mini versions of BRAVO shows with a talkback** to GBMS feeder schools, at no cost, for arts enrichment
- For each BRAVO show, we call the schools to invite classrooms to attend free of charge
- Junior BRAVO workshop in December is an opportunity for D97 grades 1 to 5 to experience that power of musical theater by learning and putting on a real show in just 6 hours!
 - BRAVO students are the teachers and leaders for the day!

BRAVO Academy and Junior BRAVO Academy summer camps are open to all grades 4-8

- Students participate from all D97 as well as the surrounding areas such as Chicago, River Forest, Forest Park, Berwyn, etc.
- Majority of the counselors are BRAVO alumni
- Community preschools and camps are invited to attend summer performances

The BRAVO program operates within Brooks with two core staff members who work full time on the BRAVO program, wearing countless hats, including:

Positive Learning Environment

At BRAVO! all participants are engaged in hands-on, real-world experiences and feel safe, empowered, supported, and valued.

- BRAVO shows are no-cut. Every child that shows up to audition will be cast
- Larger roles are double cast to provide more opportunities to more kids
- No-audition roles available for ۲ those who want less of a commitment
 - Crew club, dance team and guitar - free, after school, join any time
- Special Ed children participate as • available + interested

Access: Advisory Board developing initiatives re: transportation, snacks, scholarship, family mentors

Focused on Whole Child

- Aligned with social workers and understand who needs what
- Artistic Director makes personal ۲ contact with teachers and parents when students are struggling academically
- BRAVO hires/coordinates to have BRAVO alum return as mentors and oversee homework help table during longer rehearsals
- Older children are trained to be mentor/leaders and work with the younger kids
 - Dance captains
 - Crew club
 - Junior BRAVO workshop
 - InSPirED workshop
- Partner with D97 teachers to provide historical or social context where necessary







Goals and Dreams

- Working with CAST on collaboration and cross-overs
- Additional after-school programs: filmmaking, improv, spoken word
- Increased diversity of Bravo Advisory Board (BAB)
- Student focus groups to understand other programming that may be of interest
- Expanded scholarship programs
- BAB Family support: FAQs and mentoring, carpool and emergency contact support, snacks, summer lunches
- Robust discussions with cast members, parents and audience talkbacks
- Talking points and lessons in Playbills
- Direct collaboration with licensing houses on equity issues in show materials
