Guest Speaker in Tech Ed - On March 6th Lucas Ludwigson of GRD Masonry spoke with 18 of our students about the shortage of qualified employees in the skilled trades. He informed the students of how a job in the trades can be profitable and rewarding. He brought two of his site foreman in and had them answer questions from the students. The GRD crew spoke for about 20 mins and then they worked with the students for roughly an hour building walls of concrete block and brick. They demonstrated proper technique for layout and placing block. I have had positive feedback from all the students involved. Mr. Ludwigson's main purpose for the visit was to introduce the students to a career path they might not know exists and I feel that Mr. Ludwigson and his team did just that. The block was donated by County Materials of Rice Lake.
