Annually, each Head Start Agency must report the following information from the most recently concluded fiscal year:

	• An explanation of budgetary expenditures and proposed budget for the fiscal year.

• The results of the most recent review of the financial audit.

AWSYC is funded by a Federal Grant in the amount of \$1,299,853. The grant requires a local match of 20% or \$324,963. A total from all sources during the 2015-2016 school year for matching dollars is \$1,039,064. The award amount for 2015-2016 remained the same as the previous year and made it necessary to eliminate 1 teacher and 1 aide position. The program was able to accomplish the reduction of staff through attrition. As a result of AWSYC designation as a Head Start Program, Denton ISD is able to serve 193 students in a full day Head Start program implemented by 11 highly qualified/certified, degreed teachers.
