2025-26 and 2026-27 School Calendar Review



General Concepts in Putting Together The Calendar

- 1. Have as few broken weeks of instruction as possible
- 2. Semesters should have roughly the same number of instructional days (85)
- 3. Maintain instructional time and teacher contract days
 - 169 days of instruction at Kindergarten (850 hours required at K)
 - 170 elementary student contact (935 Hours required Grades 1-5)
 - 171 secondary student contact (935 hours required at Grade 6, 1020 hours at Grades 7-12)
 - 185 teacher total contract duty days
- 4. Minimize transportation costs (such as HS off and Elem instruction day tiered routes)
- 5. Start after Labor day required by statute (unless waiver by State)
- 6. Begin as early as possible
- 7. End as early as possible
- 8. Winter break (roughly 2 weeks) adjusts based on Jan 1 day and based on ending date of school
- 9. Spring break (1 week) Could look at this based on ending date of school
- 10. Avoid major religious holidays for events whenever possible
- 11. Yom Kippur and Eid al-Fitr non school days when they fall on instructional days (starting 2023-24)
- 12. Graduation should not be held on Friday
- 13. Approve next year's calendar and develop draft of year after that for planning.



Further Review of Religious Holidays

The Board has asked administration to relook at future calendars and get input on Observance of Jewish and Muslim Holidays.

Administration will provide options for the Board to consider, which would be:

- 1. Not change the 2025-26 calendar
- 2. Expand the guidance for incorporating religious observed days
- 3. Convene the calendar committee review with Muslim and Jewish representatives to provide perspectives to guide future calendars.

The 2025-26 Calendar works out and Yom Kippur and Eid al-Fitr are observed non-instructional days. If the Board wanted to change from Yom Kippur to Rosh Hashanah for 2025-26 that would be possible as Rosh Hashanah would observed on Tuesday September 23, 2025

Finally, we will review how the observed days work out for school calendars through 2029-2030.



General Concepts in Putting Together The Calendar

Current guideline #11:

- Yom Kippur and Eid al-Fitr will be non-school days when they fall on instructional days (starting 2023-24)
- For 2024-25 school year, the Board approved the observance of Rosh Hashanah on October 3, 2024, because Yom Kippur fell on a Saturday.


Possible revised guideline for determining the observed days starting 2026-27:

- Yom Kippur and Eid al-Fitr will be non-school days when they fall on regular instructional days.
- If Yom Kippur falls on a weekend or other non-school day, then Rosh Hashanah will be observed.
- If Eid al-Fitr falls on a weekend or other non-school day, then Eid al-Abha will be observed.
- The district will work with members of the Jewish and Muslim faith communities to review dates for the holidays as they change each year.

For Jewish and Islamic holidays Starting at Sundown, the designated non-instructional day would be the day after the start of the holiday. Example: If the Holiday starts at sundown on Wed, then Thursday would be the designated non-instructional day.



2025-26 Approved Jan 9, 2024



Winter Break remains two weeks.


Yom Kippur Wednesday night Oct 1 at sundown. Non-school day Thursday, Oct 2

Eid al-Fitr (end of Ramadan) Thursday night Mar 19 and the non-school day would be Friday Mar 20.

If no changes, then the Board would not need to take any further action.



2026-27 First Draft Review



Roll over of the 2025-26 calendar. However, Labor Day start is later 9/8/2026

Yom Kippur Sunday night Sept 20 at sundown. Non-school day Monday Sept 21

Winter Break remains at two weeks.

Eid al-Fitr (end of Ramadan) Tuesday night Mar 9 and the non-school day would be Wednesday Mar 10.

Pushes last day for students to June 15th, which is late.
