Instructional Interventionist

SELECTION:

Appointed by the Board after consideration of the recommendation of the Superintendent.

QUALIFICATIONS: a.

- a. Professional Educators License with Reading Teacher or Reading Specialist Endorsement.
- b. Master's Degree in Education preferred
- c. A minimum of three (3) years experience in teaching Reading and Math in elementary grades.
- d. Health examination for new employees part-time or fulltime:
 - 1. Chapter 122 Article 34-5 of the <u>Illinois School Code</u> mandates that School Boards shall require of new employees evidence of physical fitness to perform duties assigned and freedom from communicable disease, including tuberculosis. Such evidence shall consist of a physical examination and a tuberculin skin test and, if appropriate, an x-ray. The cost of such examination shall rest with the employee.
 - 2. Prior to employment, all non-certified personnel must have a physical examination.

JOB GOAL:

Provide intensive reading and math instruction to identified small groups of students to improve academic achievement.

The Instructional Interventionist is responsible for the following:

- 1. Provide intervention services to small groups of at-risk students as identified by the district's MTSS program.
- 2. Provide training and support to classroom teachers on Tier 2 reading and math interventions.
- 3. Serve as the lead facilitator for the school's MTSS program by planning, implementing and organizing meetings for at-risk students.
- 4. Monitor the school's MTSS program to ensure compliance with district MTSS procedures and guidelines.
- 5. Administer assessments, analyze data, and plan instruction from assessment data.
- 6. Provide intensive, explicit, highly specialized reading and math instruction to at-risk students with ample practice opportunities.

- 7. Monitor student progress in ways that inform teaching and motivate learning.
- 8. Make available student materials that ensure students read and compute at their instructional level throughout the school day.
- 9. Coordinate instruction for at-risk students across content (e.g., intervention teacher collaborating with the social studies teacher).
- 10. Create practices that motivate at-risk learners and reward their progress.
- 11. Participate in on-going training to remain current in the field and continuously develop expertise in the teaching of at-risk learners. This includes state, local, national, school based, and district training and workshops.
- 12. Partner with Classroom Teachers, School and District Administrators, District Reading and Math Coordinator and other Interventionists to:
 - a. Problem-solve interventions and assistance for at-risk learners.
 - b. Motivate staff to contribute to the school wide commitment to at-risk learners.
 - c. Engage in collegial conversations to discuss student assessments and recommendations for instruction.
 - d. Interpret assessment data.
- 13. Match intervention models and materials to individual needs of students.
- 14. Prepare and maintain daily records of students seen, interventions provided, and student ongoing assessments.
- 15. Perform all other duties as assigned.
