

Welcome message from the Principal:

Welcome back to school Pirates, families and friends! We hope you will use the information in this newsletter to get ready to have a great school year!

New Staff: This year we have no new teachers and are excited about the consistency of having everyone back again! We have a new testing coordinator, Shelby Owsley, who used to live in Montana and worked for a community college as their testing coordinator. Some students may already know Shelby as she was a substitute in the district this past school year. We also have two new instructional assistants: Samantha Brown and Jenni Stinnett. Samantha previously worked as a nurse but is studying to become a speech pathologist assistant. Jenni is our Site Council parent representative and has been working with NCRD over the summer. Both ladies are Neah-Kah-Nie alumni so we are super happy to welcome them to our staff!

Remodeled Spaces: We have four beautiful new upgrades for our students, staff and community to enjoy. The largest project has been the remodeling of the Chemistry Lab. Everything is sparkling and new and ready for science experiments galore. Another exciting upgrade has been made to room 6—previously room 6 was used to be just another meeting room. Now it is a fully functional, creatively inspiring "Maker Space". Students will be able to access this room for school projects and to learn about robots, electronics and to invent, create and produce a variety of cool, artistic and technologically enhanced pieces. Room 13 has been turned into our community/ wellness room. It is a calm, quiet space where students and staff will be able to think, work, regulate and focus on being healthy and productive. Finally, we will have new bleachers in the lower gym for our students, staff and fans to express their Pirate Spirit!

Ongoing practices: The staff continues to develop skills and abilities to assist students in achieving their potential. Last year we learned about "Constructing Meaning" techniques teachers can use to help students understand more, use richer academic vocabulary and language skills, write fluently and speak more eloquently. We will continue to develop our expertise using these techniques while also exploring basic ideas about how to promote emotional resilience and a growth mindset that will help all students overcome the barriers life throws at them. Our goal is to fight the close minded perceptions that cause people to think that they are "not good at math", "can't speak in public" or "aren't good writers". We will be learning about how people can unknowingly be impacted by "adverse childhood experiences" and how to help them positively navigate and overcome the issues that come as a result later in life. Some refer to this as "trauma informed care". To us it makes sense. We want to make sure we support our students not just academically but as people that learn and perceive things differently. If you are interested in learning along with us, give me a call. I'll share the book titles, times and dates of our professional development!

Reminder of Rules concerning cell phones/ electronic devices: Our policy at school is that cell phones are off and away during instructional time. Students and staff need to be able to focus and be productive. We have reinstated our wi-fi access but students have to log in with their school district ID and passwords and abide by our technology appropriate use policies.

Opportunities to be involved: We are always looking for great people to be substitute teachers, instructional assistants and custodians...you do not need to have a teaching degree to be a substitute teacher! Dual credit classes through Northwest Promise and Willamette Promise have a 1 time fee of \$30 for the year and dual credit classes through Tillamook Bay Community College that are taught by our teachers are free! College Options: NKN is excited to continue our partnership with TBCC and offer community college classes in our north county satellite classrooms. This partnership helps us offer students a wider variety of courses -- classes that feed into excellent career paths like Health Occupations and the new Natural Sciences program.

Reminders and other information:

Closed Campus: NKN campus is a closed campus for **freshmen** for the entire school year.

Sophomores, juniors and seniors must earn their off campus privileges by being in good standing academically (checked every three weeks after progress reports are out) and maintaining acceptable behavior. The complete details can be found in the Student Handbook under the "C"s. At any time, parents may request that we limit off-campus privileges for their student even if they meet criteria. Our desire is to maintain a safe, responsible and respectful learning environment both in school and in the community.

Parking Permits: In order to park on school property, student drivers must register with the office, provide proof of driver's license and insurance. The parking permit will remain on file with the school office and must be displayed in the vehicle (for families that share multiple vehicles we are happy to issue multiple parking permits).

School Improvement Goals: We want all of our students to continue to increase their achievement in the core areas of reading, writing and mathematics so they can be prepared for success in all their classes and life endeavors. In order to meet our improvement goals we will continue to have a school-wide focus on reading comprehension and writing well, which includes multiple opportunities to read and write in every subject area, and three benchmark assessments per year that will enable students to demonstrate essential skills in reading, writing and math which are required for graduation.

Extra support with reading, writing and mathematics is available during school hours. In addition to the advisory class, students may take the elective class called "On Course". We also have after school tutoring Monday through Thursday. Please contact the office if you have questions or want to discuss special education and 504 services for your student.

Every year we assess the effectiveness and efficiency of our operations and ask you how satisfied you are with our school and programs. Feedback from all our stakeholders is critical to this work. Please plan to attend Parent Teacher Conferences October 17th. During this conference time, your student will present you with a student led conference, there will also be time for you to meet individually with teachers in a more traditional conference session. We hope you will take time to complete our confidential school improvement survey on line which we will make available at conference time.

90% Attendance Goal for every student: Attendance is critical for success in school and prepares students for success in life. Consistent school attendance is essential and will be strictly enforced. Please see Student Handbook information under attendance. We hope that both families and students will work with us to maintain a 90% attendance rate or be collaboratively working to improve it.

1st day information packets: You student should bring home the 1st day of school a packet of forms to be filled out and returned to the high school office. Please be sure to review the forms. If your son or daughter have specific medical conditions or are taking medications (even over the counter


