Swimming and Diving State Achievements

Swimmers and divers from Keller ISD displayed exceptional talent and athleticism at the UIL State Championship, held Feb. 21-22 at the University of Texas at Austin, bringing home an impressive 11 state titles. Keller High's boys team secured its third consecutive UIL 6A State Championship title with 265 points, dominating the competition with a 135-point lead over the second-place team. The Keller High girls team also reached the top of the podium, winning the UIL 6A title with 243.5 points. Timber Creek's Owen Wall made his mark by capturing the UIL 6A State Diving Championship and earning the UIL Boys 6A Diver of the Meet title. Keller's Maximus Williamson was named the UIL Boys 6A Swimmer of the Meet after winning five state titles and setting two class 6A, state, and national records in the 100-yard and 200-yard freestyle events. Keller High swim coach Jamie Shults was honored as the 2025 UIL Boys Swimming and Diving Coach of the Year.
