State funding: "TBE/TPI"

- Grant Period: July 1st—June 30th
- of the grant application and additional information requested in the first part received at least a moderate or a high level of service Allocation is based on the number of ELs reported in enrolled in a TBE full-time, TBE part-time or TPI and the Student Information System (SIS) who were
- Moderate level of EL service is 5 or more periods but fewer than 10 per week
- Higher Level of EL service is funding for 10 or more periods per week



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State funding: "TBE/TPI"

State funding: "TBE/TPI"

- related to running a TBE/TPI program Funding to reimburse districts for excess costs
- (budget: Function 1000) At least 60% of the TBE/TPI budget must be allocated for instructional related activities
- Proration of the total expenditure report is usually 60-70%
- No carryover

LIPLEPS

- Grant Period: Sept. 1 Aug. 31
- Funding formula is based on:
- ELs with any completed "ELL Placement—Entry Status" on the Student Information System (SIS)
- Private school students reported in the Enrollment Summary and Ceiling Calculator
- Must generate at least \$10,000 in funding to be eligible to apply as a single district.



LIPLEPS

- Districts applying as individual entities
- \$10,000 minimum requirement must have: Districts forming a consortium to meet the
- Two or more districts
- One acts as administrative agent
- Treated as one entity for funding and accountability



LIPLEPS Funding Requirements

LIPLEPS Funding Requirements

- Budget must include funding for:
- Instructional activities
- Professional development
- Budget may include funding for:
- Parent outreach and training activities
- Other sub-grantee activities (Sec. 3115 (d))

LIPLEPS Required Activities

Required Activities – Professional Development

- To provide high-quality professional development to or community-based organizational personnel teachers, principals, administrators, and other school
- To improve instruction and assessment of ELL students
- To enhance ability to use curriculum, assessment and instructional strategies for ELLs
- Research based, effective professional development
- Of sufficient intensity and duration to have a positive and lasting impact





- Grant Period: Sept. 1 Aug. 31
- Student Eligibility: Public school (SIS) and private school (Ceiling Calculator in IWAS)
- Born outside of the U.S. and Puerto Rico
- In U.S. schools for fewer than 3 full academic years



- Timely and meaningful consultation during the design and development of services
- Topics for consultation
- how the children's needs will be identified;
- what services will be offered;
- how and where the services will be provided;
- how services will be assessed; and
- how the results of the assessment will be used to improve those services

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
