Argyle ISD is very proud to serve a growing, diverse student body. The district served 5,414 enrolled students for the 2023-2024 school year with the following ethnicity distribution and consisting of 48.9% females and 51.1% males:

- 63.2% White
- 14.2% Asian
- 14.1% Hispanic
- 4.8% Two or More Races
- 2.5% African American
- 1.0% American Indian
- 0.1% Pacific Islander

Notable accomplishments include a district attendance rate of 96.4%, a graduation rate of 100% and 53.4% of students enrolled in an advanced course. The class of 2022 graduated with 78.1% of the class earning a CCMR point. The district has a 66.3% CCMR enrollment rate 9-12 and a 25% enrollment district-wide. The district serves 11.7% of students through Special Education. For the 23-24 school year, the district had an 8% mobility rate and 0.8% of students with discipline placements.

Over half (52.2%) of Argyle ISD teachers had 11 of more years of experience and 45.3% of teachers with experience ranging from 1-10 years. The district average of number of students per teacher is 15.1:1. The average class size ratio in grades K-6th is 21:1, and secondary class size ratio is 20:1 for core subjects and LOTE.
