Principals' Report

Phase 2 continues to go well for the majority of our students. Our campus students are adapting well to their new teachers and classmates. Parents have been amazingly supportive of the extra layers of guidelines and safety protocols that are in place. Staff continue to pull together to meet the needs of students and each other.

Our Remote Students are progressing well also. Students are beginning to attend classes more regularly. Remote teachers will be focusing on developing relationships with their new students, reviewing schedules, and setting expectations.

Attendance

April's attendance for grade levels is the following:1) 4th Grade--80%; 2) 5th Grade--80%. We currently have 7 students that have remained dropped. We have completed the district process for referring these cases to Family Court. Two recently re-enrolled in school! Infinite Campus letters for 3 day, 5 day, 7 day, and 10 day absences have been mailed out consistently since the beginning of 3rd quarter. We will report on 4th quarter mailings in the next board report. Our current enrollment is 278 students.

Parent and Community Communication

At Napi we continue to use all forms of communication such as, phone call, mail, email, social media, and home visits. Homeroom teachers send out weekly newsletters to all students and parents via email or facebook.

Family Literacy and Events

For the month of May Napi will be hosting a virtual family literacy night every Thursday from 4:00-5:30. All family literacy events can be joined through our Napi Activities google classroom. On May 27th Napi will be ending our year with a parking lot BINGO from 4:00-5:30 in the Napi parking lot, everyone is welcome to join. Week of May 25th-27th Napi will be doing a spirit dress up week to end the school year. Daily themes will be communicated to all Napi students and families.

SBAC Testing/Benchmark Testing

Napi students starting SBAC testing on April 5th. We finished with all our scheduled testing on April 29th. We will continue to do make-up testing throughout the month of May. Napi will also be starting on grade level benchmark testing on May 4th, these tests include ISip and AimsWeb. We scheduled for our remote students to come into the Napi gym to do the tests with the instructional coaches.

Instructional Coaches Report

April has been an extremely busy month so far! Both coaches have assisted with assessing the SBAC test for 4th and 5th grade students. We met with both our ELA and Math consultants in early April to finalize the remainder of our academic year with students and how to best support our teachers and students in the time we have remaining. We are adjusting our Continuous Improvement Plan as well as our Action Plan. We are gearing up to take the CNA survey soon so that we can further update our CIC plans. Parent Teacher conferences were held and the coaches offered assistance for our newer teachers for support. The coaches have been preparing to plan for the upcoming school year, going through inventory and supplies that may be needed in our curricular programs. Although walkthroughs continue to take place, neither coach has been successful in initiating and completing any new coaching cycles for the month of April. We plan on diving right back into our support of staff as soon as our SBAC assessments are completed for the month. Planning for the remainder of the year has been rolled out and we are gearing up for wrapping up our tremendously successful, if not crazy school year!

Counselors Report:

Jason Andreas - Pretty excited to be back in the building and serving students directly Monday, Tuesday and Thursday and remotely Wednesday and Friday during the month of April. All counseling and support services are currently available to both remote and in person students. All students in grades 4 and 5 receive the Second Step Curriculum (social emotional skills) during special time and this month we are focusing on emotional management and what to do when we have

strong emotions. Individual counseling is also being utilized for students who need additional support.

We continue to provide attendance outreach (5 and 7 day phone calls and home visits) to students that are struggling to participate in school.
