December was a very short but busy month at Browning Middle School. There were only 16 possible instructional days, but we were only able to instruct fourteen days due to cancellations for a weather day, a one day district closure for school safety, and a shortened day due to the start of Winter/Christmas Break. Here are some of the highlights from the month:

- Our Math Consultant, Mary Buck, was here on December 9th. She is doing a marvelous job working with building administrators, instructional coaches and grade level math teachers as we continue to implement the new math curriculum.
- Also on the 9th, our Elective Department had their Family Literacy Night. Thirty-six parents and students joined elective staff and met in Ms. Gilroy's room for a fun evening of cookie baking and decorating, as well as making Christmas decorations.
- The school board came on December 14th to hold their monthly meeting. Board members, along with administrative staff, were treated to a lunch followed by their board agenda and a verbal building report. BMS BNAS students sang and prayed before the meeting began, and seven staff members were recognized for their important contributions at BMS. A presentation was given by staff members on our Friday Advisory schedule and the good work that is happening schoolwide during those days.
- On December 15th, BMS students combined with BHS students for their winter concert at Browning High School. It was an exciting time for both our band and choir students, since this event was postponed last year due to Covid-19.
- A wonderful Christmas feast was prepared by Lynne Keenan and her crew to treat our staff prior to Christmas Break. Prime rib, a baked potato and green beans highlighted the meal, secret Santas were revealed, and a white elephant gift exchange took place. It was a great time and enjoyed by all!

- Toys for Tots gifts arrived on December 14th, and were distributed to BMS students on December 22nd as they left for winter break. A total of 442 toys were distributed to students. Items given out were a Word STAX Game, an Activity Watch, Lip Gloss, a Science/Biology game and remote control Spider. There are still plenty of toys for the students that were not in attendance on the 22nd, or that were checked out early. Remote and 504 students also had toys set aside for them to be picked up by their guardian(s).
- I am happy to report that at this time, all of our cameras have been installed both inside and outside of the building. By logging into Verkada, we are now able to monitor our building and investigate incidents as needed. As of this building report, however, we are unable to view portions of the new editions (cafetorium and gym) as they are still not up online.
- The start of the new year signals the beginning of annual testing revving up. Winter Benchmark testing for aimsweb PLUS and WIDA will begin in January and runs until the end of the month.
