Types of conditions that have require medications at school: ADHD, Hypothyroidism, Bronchiolitis, Corneal abrasions, and Asthma require daily medication administrations. Fever, pain, allergic reactions, or stomach discomfort require as-needed medications when allowed by the parents. Emergency medications for children with anaphylactic reactions or seizure disorders remain available when provided by the parents but have not been required.

Contagious conditions: RSV; In the fall, several D-wing students stayed home sick after being diagnosed with RSV. The RSV peak coincided with the Thanksgiving Holidays. There was a COVID surge after the Christmas holidays that subsided, a Chickenpox outbreak that didn't spread to the community, and even a reported case of Mumps that also didn't have community spread. The North Slope vaccine rates continue to protect our community from vaccine-preventable diseases.

Food Allergies: IPK has five students with emergency response med orders for Epi. Allergy lists for IPK, PHO, and HMS were completed per request. IPK and HMS allergy lists were imported into a Google doc for dietary and teachers to access. Parents can call to provide allergy updates, and the Google doc is changed immediately. Parents were called to confirm allergies and offer anaphylaxis care plans for children with severe allergies. Many children have outgrown their allergies, but some parents have just chosen not to update care plans; some parents may be comfortable with the current allergy protocols. The allergy list will be available for all schools next school year.

Education: Puberty classes are being provided to the 5th-grade boys and girls at the end of the school year with parental permission. Esther organized classes with Illisagvik College to have CPR and first aid courses for NSBSD staff. Plans for next year's education classes could extend to Tobacco prevention in the Middle school, sexual education for the High school, and oral health hygiene for the Elementary school.

- 7. Persuade the NSBSD to hire another Full-time RN to allow for more time with villages.
- 8. Transition medical charting from SNAP to Power School for better efficiency.
- 9. Teach village secretaries how to chart medical interventions in Power School.
- 10. Develop a comprehensive health manual.

Changes:

- 1. Continue to utilize Power School to track vaccine compliance.
- 2. Continue to utilize Google docs to share important but changing information.
- 3. Continue to utilize a PC on wheels in the nursing exam room for increase work efficiency.






