#### **Kinship Partnership**

The District continues its strong partnership with Kinship of Polk County through its school mentoring program. This partnership is 24 years strong! According to Kinship, the overall goal of the program is to improve a child's social skills and self-esteem in order to foster a better attitude for learning; ultimately improving school success. During the 2021-22 school year, 15 mentoring relationships existed, including 12 brand new relationships! Mentors and mentees spend time developing social skills and building relationships by playing board games, shooting hoops in the gym, and conversing. Establishing Kinship matches is ongoing throughout the year and we expect our 2022-23 numbers to be similar to last year's.

#### **Door Replacement**

#### **State Superintendent Address at State Conference**

In Dr. Underly's 2022 State of Education Address on September 22, she touched upon many topics. The following three themes are highlighted by the Department of Public Instruction. Related to increased investments in public education, she stated, "We need robust, ongoing, reliable funding for our public schools and libraries. Because investing in public schools is an investment in us, too."

Regarding the achievement gap, Dr. Underly suggests a reframing of the term, instead choosing to look not at an achievement gap, but as an input gap. "We cannot call it an achievement gap, because a gap in outcomes is caused by a gap in inputs. And we can do something about the inputs."

Dr. Underly also spoke to safe learning environments, particularly creating affirming and welcoming school communities. "When we have welcoming and affirming schools and classrooms, it creates belonging. Belonging creates community. Community creates young people who are engaged in the civic life of our state."

#### **State Report Cards**

We expect the final release of the 2021-22 state report cards in early to mid-November. Districts have been working with preliminary report cards for the past two weeks, identifying data related questions. Once those questions throughout the state have been addressed and adjustments have been made, final report cards will be released.

#### **Baseball Dugouts**

The baseball field dugouts at the high school have been replaced with a new fence dugout model. These have become more popular because they allow for better supervision and airflow. A shade screen is utilized to keep athletes out of the direct sunlight as much as possible.
