As part of their senior year as an Arts Magnet students are expected to complete a Senior Capstone project. This project is a demonstration of the knowledge they gained in their art area concentration. Projects will be exhibited or performed during the end of the 4th term. Students can create project this in one of several ways.

OPTION #

- 1. Create your Capstone as part of an upper level arts course. This would be above and beyond the normal required work required in class, but can be related to it, an expansion on an existing project or something new.
- 2. Create your project in an after school setting (i.e.: a dance studio, music lessons, a band, or a community class) where you already work on your art and have the resources, supervision and time to do it.
- 3. Register for the Senior Capstone project course offered here at BHS during the 3rd term. Ms. Tamte will teach the class and it will allow for you to pursue your arts interest and create your project. If you want to participate in a mentorship program you should choose this option.

As part of the Capstone project you will choose a supervising teacher (from your Arts Concentration Area) to give you feedback on the content.

If you choose options 1 or 2 you will receive a pass/fail grade, if you choose option 3 you will get a letter grade (A-F) from Ms. Tamte and the supervising teacher.

Students who wish to work with a professional in an art area of interest (mentorship experience) will need support to formulate a plan, meet with a mentor and successfully accomplish a project that demonstrates their learning. This course provides a format and structure for this experience, guidance in writing the proposal and supervision during the mentorship.

Prerequisites:

Participation in the Arts Magnet program, preferably senior status although juniors with a compelling argument will be considered. Supporting coursework in their Art area of interest.

Budget Needs

If this is taught as an enrichment course we will need staffing money for the after hours "Block 5" instructor. Minor paper and printing costs. Possible collaborating artist or mileage costs.
