RE: Consolidated District Plan (CDP) 2025-2026 School Year

BACKGROUND

The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires school districts to submit, and annually review, a Consolidated District Plan (CDP). All grants that we receive federal funding for are written into the CDP with the purpose of ensuring that all children receive a high-quality education. It also supports professional development needs for educators to contribute to teacher quality and provides early intervention for our earliest learners.

Dr. Salamone provides leadership for the Benjamin School District 25 CDP, which is developed with timely and meaningful consultation with stakeholders in the district. Our school district receives just over \$200,000 in annual federal money through the CDP.

IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Act) = approx. \$116,000

- 10% allotment is required for PD. Goal is to focus on individual student and classroom need or training on instructional tools, interventions, and communication systems.
