

Pax Resources to Support Parents and Caregivers

PAX Good Behavior Game creates a nurturing environment in the classroom.

Unfortunately as schools are closed the nation's children aren't able to visit their PAX classrooms!

MS Updates

Distance learning is off and running. We handed out chromebooks and belongings left in lockers on Apr. 8-9. Most students have had some experience already with online learning platforms in class so the amount of training needed for students won't detract from the gains we will be able to make. Some teachers are getting Google classroom setup, others already have it ready to go. Science is continuing to use it's online curriculum, StemScopes, and social studies is using Active Classroom which is part of their online curriculum. Another effort we are putting our energy toward is helping families who don't have internet access and determining how we can still support the learning of students in that situation. During this time of great upheaval, we are doing everything we can to make sure our students' social-emotional needs are being met as well by having staff check in with their advisory students as often as needed. Our first goal right now is to make sure our students still feel loved, appreciated, and have what they need to get through each day.

Instructional Approach

Since we left campus in March:

SSD has been working on a goal to provide standards-based supplemental learning for students that they can complete at home. Our licensed staff will be providing this learning because we know our students and are best prepared to meet their needs. Staff will provide weekly materials online and by hard copies. We hope to provide feedback to each student, but will not be grading content.

To help parents and students better understand what "supplemental learning" means, we are providing definitions for what it is and what it is not:

Supplemental learning is developmentally appropriate standards-based activities across all content areas that are engaging, optional for students and families and accessible both on and offline. Feedback can be used to support engagement and enhance learning.

Supplemental learning is NOT a replacement for classroom instruction. It is not required or graded.

Now, we are moving forward with the state's move towards distance learning for all students. We are prepared to distribute Chromebooks to students this week, April 8th and 9th. We are still preparing for additional Chromebooks to be available for students, we will keep you updated on our progress and the distance learning programing.
