

- Who We Are 53 Staff
 - Director
 - Operations Supervisor
 - Dispatcher/Route Coordinator
 - Secretary
 - 38 Bus Drivers
 - 8 Special Education Bus Monitors
 - I full time Fleet Maintenance Supervisor/Technician
 - 2 part time Technicians





Transportation Department Report

- Who We Are Certifications and Licenses
 - Director and Operations Supervisor are certified Texas Association for Pupil Transportation (TAPT) "Officials"
 - Dispatcher/Route Coordinator has successfully obtained "Driver Trainer" certification and various other TAPT certifications
 - All technicians are Automotive Service of Excellence (ASE) Certified Technicians with many TAPT certifications
 - All drivers and supervisory staff
 - Hold a commercial driver's license
 - Have successfully completed pre-employment drug screening, Department of Transportation (DOT) physicals, background checks, and fingerprinting
 - Have completed the 20 hour School Bus Driver Certification Course mandated by the State and renewable every 3 years with an 8 hour recertification course
 - Are subject to random drug and alcohol screening and DOT physicals annually
 - Most are certified in CPR/First aid and special education equipment





Transportation Department Report

What We Do - Provide and Maintain The Following:

- 132 square miles served daily
- 660,000 plus miles traveled yearly for routes and trips
- 2,000 plus students transported daily to and from school
- 67 buses for regular, Special Education, and academic shuttle routes, as well as for field trips and spare buses
- 26 elementary routes and 26 secondary routes daily
- 8 elementary and 8 secondary Special Education routes daily
- 5 midday routes daily for Pre-K and Early Childhood programs
- 3 shuttles daily for academic purposes
- 45 "white fleet" vehicles for student/staff travel, Maintenance, Technology, Police, Band Instruments, and Fleet Maintenance
- Average age of bus fleet is 6 years & 8 years on "white fleet"
