This is an opportunity for residents, business and property owners, parents/guardians, students and employees of the Red Wing School District to address the board related to the management of the district. Members of the public must address their remarks with civility and respect. We require that you adhere to the guidelines set in place by District Policy 206 regarding public comment. Failure to do so will result in losing the privilege to speak during public comment.

This is a listening opportunity for the board and not a time to debate an issue. The Minnesota Government Data Practices Act prohibits comment about specific student or staff matters, even without naming them, in open session. The board respects and values public input, but when it relates to a specific student, staff or administrator or to a specific matter, such input must be heard by the appropriate personnel such as the building principal or superintendent, and not during an open meeting of the school board.

You are limited to one, three-minute presentation. You are not allowed to yield your time to another person. When you stop speaking, your time is over. You will address the board from the public comment table. After being recognized by the board chair, identify yourself and the group you represent, if any. State your reason for addressing the board.

The board may allot up to thirty total minutes at each regular school board meeting for public comment. Public comment is not available at workshops, special meetings or closed sessions.
