Unlike the prior plan, one initiative will be focused on to achieve in each upcoming year. The proposed initiatives for this plan will be presented in August for Board approval.


Used SMART goals model to achieve success


Initiatives will be developed under the SMART format (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Time bound).

Teaching & Learning Environment

District 13 will support student centered learning environments with opportunities for students to lead instruction for their peers (or adults) during the 2019-2020 school year.



Learning Environments that are...

Student Centered

- → Allow for greater engagement in learning;
- → Enable students to be creative, critical thinkers;
- Provide flexibility in instruction for the teacher

Student Led

- → Helps synthesize theory and practice through application
- → Helps the teacher act more as a facilitator of the learning
- → Empowers students in their own learning



Communication & Collaboration

District 13 will make efforts to communicate and collaborate with the community to share progress on topics identified in listening opportunities from the year prior.



Communication and Collaboration will focus upon:

- → Creating more video messages delivered through links to the website or a District 13 YouTube page.
- → Maintaining focus group and other face-to-face opportunities to share and listen to information in a collegial manner.
- → Use surveys and electronic communication strategies to collect and deliver information to the community.



Finance

District 13 will develop staffing plans to ensure human and financial resources are meeting the needs of students within the parameters of a balanced budget model.



Staffing and Good Stewardship

- Staffing plans will include all employee groups;
- → Plans will involve the collection of data to determine the successful impact on student growth;
- Decisions will be made within the requirements of the Illinois School Code, District policy and practices;

- Balanced budgets are an expectation of the Board of Education;
- → 70% of expenses in the Education Fund are directly tied to staff salaries and benefits;
- District 13 service delivery models will be protected and, should reductions be required, they will be made as far from the classroom as possible.
