



CHALLENGE: ADD 450,000 DEGREES/CERTIFICATES OVER THE NEXT DECADE BEYOND EXPECTED GROWTH

## The Four-Year College Calculus

- Need 500,000 additional BA and Grad Degrees by 2030
- Demographics may produce 200,000
- Leaves 300,000 from current 2.65 million 25-64 yearolds without degrees—1.5 million if limit to 25-50 yearolds
- Of 1.5 million: ½ have some college, ½ HS degree only
