Analysis

Successes in 2015-2016:

Survey: Of the parents/guardians responding to the email survey, **86%** of volunteers reported they had made a positive contribution, a slight decline from the prior year of 87.7%.

- Record number of **community volunteer applicants 1,404** this past year.
- Clothes Closet/Shoe Box operations served **1,507** students **(2,244 visits)**. Over **463 volunteers** provided **2,060 hours** to support this important service to students in need. The Shoe Box fulfilled **94** emergency requests for shoes. Approximately 24,500 items were distributed during the year. Volunteers with area community organizations continue to provide service during the extended hours of 4:00 7:00 p.m. Over a third of Clothes Closet clients came between the hours of 4:00 7:00 p.m.

We developed a plan with T & L Research staff to get more parent/guardians to participate in the survey and give us feedback. Success! **7,149 parents/guardians** completed the survey, nearly tripling the response rate in 2015.

Issues:

• Volunteer hours are under-reported for after-school, evening activities and sports at high school level.

Action Plan

2016-2017:

- Full implementation of the new **Integrated Volunteer Management System (VMS-Better Impact)** to improve volunteer service tracking and Background Check functionalities. The new system was phased in during 2015-16 and schools are still working to integrate fully.
- Support **school-based volunteer coordinators and PTO leaders with professional development** in volunteer management and leadership. Johanna Shrout, Volunteer Services Coordinator, supports these leaders providing workshops and just-in-time training and support.
- The Volunteer Services Coordinator position was increased to 260 days in response to increased demand supporting school volunteers and implementation of the new VMS.

Long-term:

Better Impact, the new Integrated Volunteer Management System is in place at all schools. The new system allows volunteers to update their volunteer commitments and hours, and we can match skills with needs. As part of the new system, our Public Safety Office will be able to conduct Background Checks every two years in a more systematic way. We will work with middle and high school volunteers to encourage them to utilize 'time clock' feature in the new system. This allows volunteers to track time from any device that has Internet access.

VOLUNTEERS**

The District expects and shall encourage families and community members to be active participants in our schools. They shall be welcomed, valued and connected to each other, school staff and what students are learning and doing in class.

It is essential that we recruit and organize parent and community support in order to enrich the educational opportunities for all students.

The safety of students is paramount. Volunteers shall operate under the direction of a licensed staff member and shall be within sight or sound of a licensed staff member while working with students.

Any person authorized by the District for volunteer service into a position having direct, unsupervised contact with students, i.e. volunteer coaches, will be required to undergo an Oregon criminal records check.

The District reserves the right to place and remove volunteers from service in the District.

The District encourages the establishment of associations to support volunteerism, (Community Engagement Committees, Parent Groups, Booster Clubs, Parent/Teacher Associations, Parent/Teacher Organizations) in each of the District's schools. The District urges the administrators and faculties of the schools to support, encourage and participate in the programs.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop administrative regulations to implement this policy and provide guidelines for the management of the community volunteer programs, recruitment of and training of volunteers and the training of professional staff in the optimal utilization of volunteers.
