Beaverton School District Automotive Technology National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) Accreditation – Louise Drow and Claudia Leppert

The Beaverton School District Automotive Technology Program recently received re-certification of their accreditation by the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF).

NATEF was founded to develop, encourage, and improve automotive technician education. NATEF examines the structure and resources of training programs and evaluates them against nationally accepted standards of quality. NATEF's precise national standards reflect the skills that students must master to be successful in this field. The NATEF evaluation process ensures that accredited training programs meet or exceed industry-recognized, uniform standards of excellence.

The Automotive Technology Program is a yearlong, college-level option program in the Beaverton School District that offers dual credit through Portland Community College (PCC) in four areas: engine performance, electrical/electronic systems, steering and suspension and breaks.
