

IN AN EMERGENCY TAKE ACTION



HOLD! In your room or area. Clear the halls.

STUDENTS

Clear the hallways and remain in room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
Do business as usual

ADULTS

Close and lock the door
Account for students and adults
Do business as usual



SECURE! Get inside. Lock outside doors.

STUDENTS

Return to inside of building
Do business as usual

ADULTS

Bring everyone indoors
Lock outside doors
Increase situational awareness
Account for students and adults
Do business as usual



LOCKDOWN! Locks, lights, out of sight.

STUDENTS

Move away from sight
Maintain silence
Do not open the door

ADULTS

Recover students from hallway if possible
Lock the classroom door
Turn out the lights
Move away from sight
Maintain silence
Do not open the door
Prepare to evade or defend



EVACUATE! (A location may be specified)

STUDENTS

Leave stuff behind if required to
If possible, bring your phone
Follow instructions

ADULTS

Lead students to Evacuation location
Account for students and adults
Notify if missing, extra or injured students or adults



SHELTER! Hazard and safety strategy.

STUDENTS

Use appropriate safety strategy for the hazard

Supporting School Safety: The Role of Police

OAK PARK COLLABORATES
Our three agencies are committed to:
 • Prioritizing the physical and emotional safety of our students and staff every day.
 • A comprehensive approach to school safety that includes our entire community and is rooted in a shared interest in creating safe and supportive learning environments for all students.
 • Collaboration with Oak Park's agency partners to leverage expertise and efficiency for optimum service and support in maintaining safe and healthy school communities.
 • District administration holding the primary responsibility for maintaining order in the school environment and for investigation and responding to school disciplinary measures.

Protecting the physical and emotional safety of our students
Our shared agreement ensures that appropriate procedures are in place for those circumstances in which cooperation between the agencies becomes necessary.

LAW ENFORCEMENT WILL ONLY BE PRESENT IN OUR SCHOOLS TO...

1. Respond to Safety Incidents
 • Threats of violence
 • Weapons on site
 • Illegal substances on site
 • Medical emergencies
 • Fires, or other issues related to building safety


2. Conduct Safety Drills & Planning
 Per state law, police must be on site during school lockdown drills to observe and evaluate the effectiveness of the drills.
 Police will also be on site to attend threat assessment team meetings.

3. Support Career Education and Safety Prevention Learning
 Police may be in our schools participate in educational events, such as a speaker during Career Days or other safety education.

The police will **NOT** be called for student discipline. Law enforcement will be contacted for student matters related to an illegal act on school grounds or at a school-related activity. If the police need to question a student, the student's parent or guardian will be notified. All reasonable efforts will be made to ensure that the student's parent/guardian is present during the questioning. If not, specific school personnel will be present.

The only instance in which the police may interact with a student without a parent/guardian or specific school personnel present is in the event of an active emergency that is being facilitated by law enforcement.



Common Training, Language and Visuals



Stay Informed


In the event of an emergency, District 97 will use email, texts and/or robocalls to share updates as quickly as possible.

Here are a couple of tips to ensure that you receive all communication:

- **Keep your contact information up-to-date**
 - **Families:** The district utilizes phone numbers and email addresses provided during registration. If you need to update your contact information, please call your school office.
 - **Staff:** Emergency contact lists are created using the district's payroll system, iVisions. Staff should confirm or update phone numbers at the start of every school year.




Communicating Quickly, While Prioritizing Emergency Response

During an emergency situation, our first priority is the safety of our students and staff, however, we understand the importance of communicating information to the community as quickly as possible. If you see emergency responders at your child's school, please do not jump to conclusions or speculate. We will contact you if there is a safety incident.

The district has established strong communication systems between schools, leaders at central office, and the Oak Park police and fire departments in order to gather and confirm accurate information in a timely manner. We aim to provide as much detail as possible, however, we are sometimes limited in what we can share due to privacy laws or ongoing investigations.

We appreciate your patience as we work to verify information and coordinate our communication with emergency responders.



Email, Robocalls and Text Messages

For most safety incidents—such as fire alarms, medical emergencies or temporary holds, our schools will send an email notification once the situation has resolved.

Emergency Closings Due to Inclement Weather

District 97 always strives to have schools open.

However, our top priority is the safety of our students and staff. If heavy snow or extreme cold make it dangerous to travel, we may need to close schools.



Making the Decision to Close Schools

The superintendent determines when and if conditions warrant the closing of schools. This decision is normally made in consultation with superintendents from districts 90 and 200, village officials, and our transportation provider.

Because of the many families enrolled in both District 97 and District 200, we strive for alignment when circumstances allow.

Variables Affecting the Decision

- Weather forecasts (advisories, watches, warnings, amount/timing of precipitation, temperature)
- Internal and external building conditions (power, light, heat, clear sidewalks)
- Availability of bus transportation and food service
- Conditions of streets, sidewalks and alleyways throughout the community

Transportation

Communication Plan

- Dedicated customer service representative and phone number for D97



Timely Drop off and Pick Up

- Adjusted times to reduce late drop-off and pick-ups
- Prior notification for bus delays (minimum 20-30 minute lead time)



Other Considerations

- D97 provided de-escalation training for Lakeview drivers and assistants.
- All drivers are required to wear an ID badge and wear them while they are transporting students.
