A Reminder to Visitors and Volunteers

Parents, visitors, and volunteers must check in with the office and have a VISITORS PASS while on the campus during school hours. If you are picking up your student early please check in at the office and your student will be called to the office. If you are dropping off your student late please have your student check in at the office for a late slip. The beginning of the school day is a very important time for your student to hear daily announcements. Please have your student enter the classroom as quietly as possible. Parents, as well as community members, are always welcome to visit or volunteer in the classes at Williams Elementary School. Please make prior arrangements with the teacher and office before coming to volunteer. Visitors and Volunteers MUST fill out a Volunteer Application. Please do not enter through the side entrance at anytime during the school day. For the protection of students and the prevention of disruption, all visitors must enter and sign in at the office and pick up a visitor's pass.



Our school receives federal funds for Title One programs. Under this law, you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teacher's). If you request this information, the district will provide you with this information in a timely manner. You have the right to request the following information:

- If the teacher has met state licensing requirements for the grade level and subjects in which the teacher is providing instruction
- If the teacher is teaching under an emergency status for which state licensing requirements have been waived
- The type of college degree major of the teacher and the field of discipline for any graduate degrees and certificates
- If your child is receiving Title One services from paraprofessionals and if so, his/her qualifications
