Jog-a-thon is coming up on May 12th! We have had very positive reactions to our jog-a-thon in recent years. The jog-a-thon is a critical fund raiser that allows us to provide teachers with field trip and classroom supply money. All the money raised during the jog-a-thon goes directly to our students.

We simply would not be able to do many of the things we currently do for our students without the help of our wonderful volunteers. On May 19th we will be hosting a volunteer tea event to honor those individuals donating their time and energy to our students.

Spring is always a busy time here at Evergreen. We have a lot of classes going on field trips, holding special activities or end of the year celebrations. It is critical to have good attendance as we finish out the year so that you don't have to miss out on these special events. Many of the end-of-the year events are tied to attendance, behavior or turning in homework. Sometimes all three of these things are a factor.

Along with these fun activities; good attendance pays in other ways as well! Monday April 25th marked the beginning of our Eagle Pride Pack give away. The last day of every week for the remainder of the year we will be drawing two names from our entire student body. Once the names are drawn we will check to see if they are eligible for the Eagle Pride Pack (a collection of prizes) for the week. To be eligible for the Pride Pack a student must have perfect attendance for the week. This means that they are here every day, on time and stayed until the end of they day. They must also have good behavior, with no redirection room slips, office referrals or bus citations. If they meet the first two criteria we will check with the student's classroom teacher to see if they have putting forth a solid effort in the classroom. Any student who's name is drawn will be checked against the criteria. If they meet all the requirements they will win the weekly Pride Pack. If they are not eligible to win the Pride Pack, the prizes will be rolled over to the next week and more will be added, making the Pride Pack a cumulative reward. We look forward to recognizing those students who consistently display Eagle Pride!


