

Advanced Opportunities & Fast Forward

The Advanced Opportunities program provides every student attending an Idaho public school an allocation of \$4,125 to use towards Advanced Opportunities in grades 7-12. Mrs. Flaming will help students with applying for this state aid. The funds can be used for a variety of offerings:

Overload Courses

An overload course is a high school level course that is taken in excess of the student's regular school day. These courses are offered online, during the summertime, and before/after school. In the event that student incurs a cost for such courses, the Advanced Opportunities program can pay up to \$225 for the cost of the course. Overload courses must be above and beyond the full course load (minimum of 12 credits) offered by the student's local school.

Dual Credits

Dual credit are courses taken by high school students that are transcribed on their high school and college transcripts. The Advanced Opportunities program can pay up to \$75 per credit. Dual Credit courses can be taken online, by virtual conferencing, or in some cases students can go directly to the college/university campus. FALL 2020 State & National Testing Opportunities for HHS Students

ACT & SAT Information

The SAT and ACT are college entrance tests for students planning to enter 4-year colleges and universities. Most colleges will accept either exam but check the college admissions requirement to verify. These tests should be taken spring of the junior year and fall of the senior year. Registration materials, test dates, locations, test strategies and practice tests are available through the <u>HHS College & Career Website</u> and the <u>College Bound Test Information</u> webpage

Differences between the SAT and ACT:

The **SAT** is an aptitude test and is composed of ten-sections: three Critical Reading, three Math, three Writing, and one Experimental. The test is scored as 200-800 for each subject with 2400 being the highest possible score. The test is 3 hours and 45 minutes long.

The **ACT** is curriculum based and is composed of four sections: English, Math, Reading and Science. The essay component is optional. The test is scored as 1-36 with 36 being the highest possible score. The test is approximately 3 hours long (add a half-hour if taking the optional essay component).

SAT Test October 14th

The class of 2021 missed the opportunity to take the SAT as juniors last spring due school closures across the state. Taking a college entrance examine is a state requirement for all juniors. The class of 2021 had this requirement postponed to their senior year. On Wednesday October 14th Homedale High School will proctor the SAT for all seniors during periods 1-4. Pencils and approved calculators will be provided. Test prep for the SAT can be accessed through <u>Khan Academy</u>.



September 17th is the registration deadline for the Saturday October 24th ACT. Seniors will be helped to register for the test during Senior Leadership and Economics classes. Fee Waivers are available for the cost of the test. The test will be proctored at Homedale High School October 24th. When the HHS test center is filled, students may test at other test centers such as Caldwell or Skyview High School on the same day. For all test centers, the arrival time is between 7:30 & 7:45 a.m. Students are to bring two #2 pencils, an approved calculator (Approved Calculator List), a photo ID. (A drivers license or official DMV photo ID is mandatory) and test taker need an ACT test admission ticket. (For those taking the test at HHS, Admission Tickets will be provided)

Students were given a free online test prep program called Kaplan when they registered to take the ACT. Students access this free test prep tool by logging into their ACT account at ACT Log In. (It is recommended that students log in using their Google account). Another excellent free test prep site is called March to Success and can be found at http://march2success.com

Preliminary SAT[®]/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

PSAT/NMSQT Test October 29th

Juniors will be given the opportunity to take the PSATNMSQT October 29th during school hours periods 1-4. This test is for high achieving juniors or those juniors who are interested in extra test prep practice for the SAT. All Idaho juniors are required to take the SAT in the spring of 2021. Juniors who take the NMSQT test will have their score entered into a national scholarship competition called the "National Merit Scholarship Qualifier". The National Merit Process...following the test on October 29th the following may happen for junior NMSQT test takers:

Nothing. Juniors did not score high enough to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship, but it was good practice for the spring SAT.

They Become a Commended Student. In this situation the student is not in the running for the National Merit Scholarship, but since they impressed the selection committee with their score and academic record, they may still qualify for other scholarships sponsored by businesses and corporations.


They gualify as an NMS Semi-finalist. They made the cut...only 16,000 out of the 1.5 million who take the test actually make it this far. The semi-finalists will then be whittled down to 15,000 finalists. From there, 1,500 finalists will receive special scholarships from corporate sponsors, and 8,200 will receive the oh-so-coveted National Merit Scholarship.

PSAT Test October 29th

Sophomores across the state of Idaho are required to take the PSAT in October and Homedale High School will proctor the test on October 29th during periods 1-4.
