His enthusiastic smile might be from seeing ten years of hard work pay off!

As a young man in El Salvador, Victor was only able to attend school until the age of 12. After that, he was expected to work and help provide for his family. At the age of 21, after struggling for many years, Victor decided that moving to the United States would allow him the opportunity to improve his life. His first stop in the United States was Forest Lake and he has called the district home for the last 13 years.

Victor became involved with ABE in 2004 as a participant in Family Learning which is a joint effort with the district's Early Childhood Programs. Victor was able to take English classes while his daughter was enrolled in preschool. Victor and his family experienced success in the program and he went on to see both of his daughters prepare to enter kindergarten during their time with Family Learning. For Victor, those years meant completing ESL classes and securing a job at St. Croix Forge as a line worker. Because Victor has always envisioned better things in his life, he continued to work full-time and also kept focusing on GED prep classes in ABE. Though it took longer than he originally planned, Victor knew he'd get there. On October 22, 2013, Victor passed his last GED exam. He is now a graduate and a supervisor at St. Croix Forge. Most could look at Victor's ten year journey and call it a success story. However, he isn't done. He has realized that the GED is only a beginning, and he has now set his sights on college. Victor is continuing to work with ABE to take that next step and move even closer to the true American Dream!
