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In-school suspension may be required of a student when it is apparent that attempts to alter the student's behavior through use of corrective measures in the Unity School Student Handbook have been ineffective. In addition, students may be assigned an in-school suspension immediately as a consequence for inappropriate behavior as defined in the student handbook.

In-school suspension will provide the student with constant supervision from the time of arrival at school until the time of departure from school. This supervision will take place in a physical setting which provides minimal distractions from the student's assigned studies. The student will be responsible for the completion of the daily assignments. The student may be kept after school to finish the assigned work if he/she does not choose to complete the assignment during the regular school day. The student's assigned classroom teachers will provide daily assignments for the student while in the in-school suspension situation.

The parent of the student is to be informed of the in-school suspension as soon as possible by the student's building principal.
