

Goal #1: Student Growth and Achievement

- This year, we expanded our use of the personalized learning platform IXL. We piloted its use in 8th grade Language Arts last year and based on our MAP data in the spring, decided to expand its use to all grade levels. Students continue to be highly engaged in this resource and we have found it to be extremely effective in helping teachers identify and close gaps in student foundational reading skills.
- We continue to collaborate with our colleagues at West Chicago Community High School. Right now, we are focused on our science programming and ensuring that our students are prepared for the rigor of freshman Biology and Honors Biology. This spring, our teachers will meet with the science department to review our curriculum, assessment, and lab practices and discuss the ways that we prepare our students to read and analyze data in their Science classrooms.

Goal #2: Learning Culture of Equity, Engagement, and Agency
