

CCRS Content Standards Coming to MN ABE!

The major focus of Adult Basic Education this year has been on content standards. Along with the State's current ACES Transitions Integration Framework, and the Northstar Digital Literacy standards already being focused on in classrooms, the CCRS (Career and College Readiness Standards) have made their way to the State of Minnesota to create a three-pronged approach to instruction. These standards are based on the Common Core standards, and focus on shifts in instruction along with specific standards that need to be covered during lessons. All ABE teachers in the State are currently being asked to become familiar with the standards and determine how to implement them into current instruction with adult students. While Forest Lake ABE has been lucky enough to be included in early implementation talks at the State level, these new requirements will require changes to current teaching routines and materials. The Forest Lake ABE teachers will be participating in training this year that will help them to more thoroughly understand the new requirements and bring those new expectations back to their learners. The year ahead will bring many learning opportunities for both students and teachers.

During the 2014-2015 school year, our site worked with 221 students and led 12,000 instructional hours. The site had eight learners complete their GED, 18 learners start the process, and had 10 students earn their adult diploma. We are thankful for our 25 volunteers who donated almost 3,000 hours!
