CRES Board Report: October, 2022

2022-2023 Goals

• #1 - All Students Ready for School

80% of students in the Little Rangers program who will be entering kindergarten in the fall of 2023 will be able to identify 11 or more uppercase letters, as assessed by the BPS Early Childhood Assessment Kit.

• #2 - Read by 3rd Grade

Each grade level, 2nd through 3rd, will achieve an overall Student Growth Percentile on the spring 2023 STAR Reading assessment as follows: 2nd grade will achieve a SGP of 50, and 3rd grade will achieve a SGP of 70. 1st grade will deploy the STAR Early Literacy Assessment to determine a benchmark.

• #3 - Close the Achievement Gap

The proficiency gap on the Spring STAR math assessment between CI students qualifying for free and reduced lunch and students not qualifying for free and reduced lunch will decrease from 25.5% in 2022 to 20% in 2023.

• #4 - Career and College Readiness

90% of 9th, 10th, and 11th graders at Crosby-Ironton High School will be on track to graduate based on credits at the end of the 2022-2023 school year. *On track is defined as able to still graduate without credit recovery.

• #5 - All Students Graduate From High School

90% of seniors who begin and end the 2022-2023 school year at Crosby-Ironton High School will graduate.

AFTT We had our first AFTT meeting of the year on Monday, October 17th. In all, we had 131 families in attendance, and we had about 120 students attending "childcare" that evening. A big THANK YOU needs to go out to CRMC for sponsoring this event. They picked up the tab for the students' Subway supper, as well as provided door prizes for our grade level drawings. While it looks, on the surface, like 131 students were represented, it's actually more, as some parents may have attended one of their children's meetings, but then afterward, they stopped into their other child's classroom to get all the information from that teacher. There were many cases like this, which is great to see.

CRES Library Update Ashley Meyer has been doing an amazing job of getting the CRES library up and running. When I submitted my September report, we were just getting the bookshelves assembled. Since then, Ashley has single handedly unboxed every library book and placed them on those shelves. This was no small task, as we have A LOT of books. Math Coach Rocky LeBlanc has been extremely busy in his new role as the Math Instructional Coach. He's doing a great job of ensuring that teachers have resources, are getting comfortable with the new math curriculum, and he is sharing math best-practices with them on a regular basis.
