Subject: Night High School Annual Program Evaluation for Optional Flexible School Day Program

Background Information:

- The Night High School provides flexible school hours with additional support and interventions to 9th-12th grade LISD students via an evening program (2:05 - 7:20) at the Lewisville Learning Center to increase:
 - Successful course completion
 - High school graduation, and
 - Transition to post-secondary education and/or career of choice
- In 2019-20, LISD conducted a program evaluation of programs at Lewisville Learning Center, and historical data was presented to the board regarding Night High School. Data points included student enrollment counts, course completed, and graduation counts.
- The TEA requires that Night High School annually submit an Optional Flexible School Day Program waiver each year in order for districts to receive a prorated WADA for students attending for a minimum of 45 continuous minutes a week.
- Over the past 9 years, 365 students have graduated as a result of the Night High School program with 45 students graduating in 2025.
- The Night High School program is successfully supporting students through the flexible school day program.

Administrative Consideration:

- In order for LISD to offer the Night High School program at LLC, the School Board must annually approve LISD participating in the Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP) allowed by the legislature and monitored by TEA.
- Staff must annually submit an application and receive TEA approval in order to operate a program that utilizes OFSDP.
- The OFSDP application will be included in the June 9th Consent Agenda for the School Board.
