**AFTERNOON ADVERSE WEATHER ROUTES FOR:
North Valley, Fleming, Manzanita, Fort Vannoy and Wolf Creek**

If weather conditions are bad enough, there will be no school at all. Parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJQ, KLDR, KBOY or TV Stations KOB1 (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10), or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page to learn about this.

Another possibility is that conditions will be OK in the morning but turn bad during the day. This may require the busses to take the students home using special "Adverse Weather" routes.

The roads affected under these conditions are listed below. If you live on a road which the buses cannot travel, you should pick up your student at the nearest intersection with a road which is traveled.

<u>ROUTE #</u>	<u>ROADS BUSES WILL NOT TRAVEL</u>
A-01	Speaker Rd, Coyote Crk Rd (past Miller Gulch), Railroad Ave, Bridge Ln
A-02	Note: No stops at all in Wolf Crk area—students take A01 instead; No: Lower Wolf Creek Rd, Lower Grave Creek Rd, Sunny Valley Loop (north of Leland Rd), Sunny Glen (and connecting roads), Placer Rd (beyond 2000=Edgerton Ln)
A-03	Winona Road, Upper Granite Hill (beyond Grouse Creek).
A-04	Hugo Rd between Hitching Post and Oxyoke; Hartsfield Ln
A-05	Red Mountain; Timber Ln
A-06	Harris Road & Denver Ave; Flaming Rd; Ort Ln (beyond); Saratoga (beyond RxR tracks)
A-07	Colonial Dr, Palomino Dr (and roads extending out from Palomino), Castle Crk, Soldier Crk (except yes on short section between Lloyd Dr and Nelson Way), Highland Dr (north of Lloyd Dr)
A-09	April Drive, Becklin Dr, Crow Road, Tunnel Loop
A-10	Galice Rd (beyond Hog Creek)
A-11	Abegg, Peco, Cienaga, Iris, Pinnon, Old Azalea
A-12	Pine Crest, Plumtree; (A06 will transport Fleming & North Valley PlumTree students from Jct Plumtree & Camp Joy)
A-13	Stewart Road
A-14	Stewart Road
A-15	Sunview, Fall Run
A-16	Pickett Crk Rd
A-18	Rio Vista, West & East Jones Creek (Drop Off = CFN Fuel Station); Averill (Drop Off = Jct Averill & Foothill)
A-19	Sunny Glen (and connecting roads), Placer Road beyond 2000 (Edgerton Ln); Lower Wolf Creek Rd, Lower Grave Creek Rd. If SWE is in operation, no early drop-off @ Sunny Valley Store (bus goes directly from MZE to SWE). If no SWE, take MZE kids to Miller Gulch on Coyote Crk, then return to Sunny Valley area.
A-20	Speaker Rd, Coyote Crk Rd (past Miller Gulch), Railroad Ave, Bridge Ln
