TRANSFER STUDENTS A student who transfers into a District high school shall receive the grades that were earned in courses at other schools. Higher-level course credits earned shall receive grade points according to the list of higher-level courses offered at the receiving high school and the grade point scale used at the receiving high school. If a transfer student earned a higher-level credit (such as Level III or Level IV) for a course and the receiving high school does not offer that same course at the same higher level, then the transfer student's transcript at the receiving high school shall only reflect the level of the course as it is offered at the receiving high school.
