Food For Thought

MILK Charges: All students are charged 50 cents for their milk if it is purchased to go along with their cold lunch whether they are on the free or reduced lunch program or not. Everyone must pay 50 cents for their milk.

Dehydration might be an even bigger issue in winter than it is in the summer. The warm-weather months have something besides temperature and long days to recommend them. They're wetter.

We lose up to two quarts of water from our lungs when we exhale. When we inhale, we humidify and heat the air to our body temperature. In cold weather, our bodies have to work harder to humidify and heat. And because we're less likely to feel like drinking a glass of water-cold weather suppresses thirst—it's easy to become dehydrated, especially when we're exercising.

The extra water we drink in winter will go a long way toward helping us regulate our core temperature. So drink up—before and after your workouts and when you first wake up in the morning.
