TEA posted determination levels for our Results Driven Accountability (RDA) report in November. The RDA report analyzes district data; within special education, it looks at various components including STAAR scores, STAAR Alt. 2 participation, graduation rates, disciplinary removals and the percentage of students within certain settings.

We want to always strive to maintain zeros and 1s within special education, as these are the highest ratings. Rating explanations are as follows:

- 1- Meets Requirements
- 2- Needs Assistance
- 3- Needs Intervention
- 4- Needs Substantial Intervention

We target these areas by ensuring that ARD committees are developing strong IEPs and making appropriate programming decisions, and then ensuring students receive high quality, specially designed instruction.
