Dear Superintendent's Leadership Council and ECISD School Board,

Attached is a spring trip request for the Odessa High School Band, Orchestra and Choir to travel to Washington, D.C. and New York City from June 2-7, 2014, or the week following graduation pending approval of the calendar for the 2013-14 school year. We are requesting your approval for this trip because, as music educators, we strive to provide students with not only opportunities unique to their participation in our respective organizations, but opportunities that may not otherwise be available to them.

The trip will include three days in our nation's capital where students will visit the Smithsonian Museums and the Arlington National Cemetery as well as the numerous monuments and memorials throughout the city. While in D.C., the band and the orchestra will perform separate concerts at the World War II Memorial and the Jefferson Memorial. The itinerary for day four of the trip has the group taking the Amtrak train from D.C. to New York City where students will visit many of the historical and cultural sites located in our nation's largest city. In New York, the choir will perform a concert at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, the largest cathedral in the world.

So that students will not miss instructional time and because of the travel distance, we have opted to travel after the conclusion of the spring semester. The post school year travel date also eliminates the possibility of students paying for the trip and having to forfeit because of ineligibility.

Attached is a tentative breakdown of the projected number of students who will participate, the number of sponsors involved, the cost of the trip and a preliminary schedule. Also included is a preliminary list of the fundraisers that will be offered to help raise the necessary funds.

As stated above, our goal is to provide students in the band, orchestra, and choir programs at OHS with meaningful opportunities that many of them would not have outside of our organizations.
