Plans for the 2015-2016 school year:

- Westside Community Church has been holding services for the last couple years. Sadly, they have found a new home, but have assured me that they will continue their partnership with us.
- We have begun an extended day program called "Opportunity YOU". An integral part of the program are the community partners that are coming in to work with our students one day a week. We are recruiting partners now and we currently have 4 SPARCs (Someone Proficient and Really Cool) working in Opportunity YOU. We need actually need 12 SPARCs for each 10 week session for one day a week for 2 ½ hours. We will be recruiting all year long for adults to work in Opportunity YOU.

Summary of Progress:

We are in the beginning stages of recruitment of community partners.

Rachel Carson Environmental Middle School that is housed here at Five Oaks has many community partnerships that they have had for years. These partnerships have made the incredible site visits that the school participates in possible. They also use many adults in the surrounding community to judge their annual Science Fair. Students also connect community partners as they do their 8th grade projects.

First Tech Credit Union provided the school with over 300 backpacks filled with school supplies for the second year in a row. Five Oaks was able to share backpacks with our feeder elementary schools. We received backpacks from several other donors as well.

Plans for the 2015-2016 school year:

Future Ready STEAM Site Council: Our dedicated committee of parents, community partners, staff and students will continue to meet monthly to guide our work across the curriculum with the full integration of STEAM-focused lessons and activities. This group's action plan is currently focused on establishing a weekly news program at Highland Park Middle School.

HP News: Our intent is to have a fully functioning, student driven, news program by March, 2016. We are currently actively engaging community partners to help with accessing resources and partnerships.

Completion of Bio-Swale: We will continue our partnership to complete our bio-swale by the end December, 2015. Remaining steps to complete the bio-swale include replanting and the placement of an informational sign.

8th Grade Climate Change and Indigenous Peoples Culture Study: We will once again partner with the Wisdom of the Elders and provide an in-depth study of climate change and its effects on Pacific Northwest and Alaskan indigenous peoples.

STEAM Fair: Our parents and community will be invited to join our Summa and 7th grade classes in an exploration of hands-on Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts

and Mathematics activities. The STEAM Fair will be built to be an interdisciplinary, engaging evening of activities and learning around STEAM.

Summary of Progress:

National 4-H Youth Science Day: We partnered with Vernier, Inc., and Oregon State University to host the National 4-H Science Day on October, 7, 2015. This event was attended by over 150 middle school students from across BSD, several schools from Portland Public Schools and several private schools. Students participated in an experiment designed by Vernier, Inc. and in interactive science based stations hosted by Vernier employees.

Outdoor School: Highland Park students attended Outdoor School from October 5-8. Our 6th grade students attended Trickle Creek 4-H Camp, Cedar Ridge Camp in Vernonia and Camp Magrudder. This experience was supported by a grant from a community partner, the Grey Family Foundation.

Nike: Nike employees hosted our 300 seventh grade students in an Science of Sport activity on September 29th. This annual event is one of the highlights of the seventh grade year, as students learn skills and knowledge about how science and sport intersect in a rotation of sessions. The day culminated with a presentation to our students by Nike sponsored athlete, Anthony Robles.

OHSU: We are currently in conversations with OHSU to host our second annual Take Your Teacher To Work Day. Our intent is to annually take our teachers on a field trip to learn more about a STEAM related career.
