### **School News:**

As a school, we just completed our winter 100% meetings using the RTII process and looking at the grade level data from the winter DIBELS assessment. Every grade had celebrations on their students as a whole and as individuals. My kindergarten teacher, Suzie Garman, states that she is so impressed with the growth and that her kids are readers already. This usually doesn't happen until the end of the year. That is so amazing and a celebration that we are creating a solid foundation in our primary grades through the Journeys curriculum and the RTII process. Another amazing celebration is the first grade team. They started out the year with the year with 71% of their kids being intensive based on the universal screener, DIBELS, and now they have 49% at the winter benchmark. In the past few trends, 1<sup>st</sup> grade students are usually getting to the 50% intensive at the end of the year benchmark. What a huge growth and change in the past trends!!!! I can't wait to see the progress we make by the end of the year as a school, a grade level team, and especially individual growth!!!!!!

Here are the all of the grades DIBELS growth data at the winter benchmark:

\*Kindergarten is based only on FSF (First Sound Fluency) in September and then they are tested on FSF again, LNF (Letter Naming Fluency), PSF (Phoneme Segmentation Fluency), and NWF (Nonsense Word Fluency).
