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

APR Purpose


- Ensure the Division I Membership is Dedicated to Providing Student-Athletes:

 - Enhanced Ability to Earn a Four-Year Degree.

Academic Performance Program

- 1. Student-Athlete Accountability Through Increased Academic-Eligibility Standards.
- Enhanced Academic Rates of Measure, Real-Time Rate and Better Graduation Rate.
- 3. Team Performance Accountability Through Historical Penalties.
- Focus on Campus Efforts to Improve Academic Performance, Retention and Graduation for All Teams.



APR Calculations

Why APR?

- Real-Time Rate.
- Includes All Student-Athletes On a Team In a Given Year (as opposed to entering class).
- Points Awarded for Eligibility/Graduation and Retention.
- Term-by-Term Measurement.
- Totaled Over Most Recent Four Years.



APR Calculations (cont.)

- Two Available Points Each Academic Term.
 - Eligibility "E" Point = Student-Athlete Meets Academic Eligibility Standards for the Next Academic Term.
 - Retention "R" Point = Student-Athlete is Enrolled Full Time as of the Fifth Week of Classes or the Census Date (whichever is earlier) of the Next Term.

Number of Points Earned

Number of Points Possible X 1000 = APR

Four-Year Rolling Rate.


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APP Data Reviews

- APP Data Review Cycle Begins in Spring
 - Up to 60 Institutions are Selected Each Year.
 - GSR to Be Reviewed February to May.
 - APR to Be Reviewed May to October.
- Paper Review of All Areas of the APP Data and Application of Penalties.
 - Institutions are Required to Submit Supporting Documentation for Selected Teams and/or Student-Athletes.





Historical Penalties

- Teams With a Multiyear APR Below 900/930.
- Penalties are Progressive and Cumulative in Nature.
- Teams Must Demonstrate Three "clean" Years (without penalty) in Order to Avoid Progression in the Historical-Penalty Structure.



NEW PENALTY STRUCTURE: THREE LEVELS

LEVEL ONE:

Playing and Practice: (4 hours/1 day per week in -season, to be replaced with academic activities)

LEVEL TWO:

Playing and Practice: Four hours/1 day week in-season **AND** out of season as follows:

AND

Nonchampionship season/spring football eliminated

OR

10% of season/contests for sports with no nonchampionship season.

LEVEL THREE:

Menu of Penalties Teams would be subject to level three penalties until APR improves.



Penalty Structure: Level Three Menu of Penalties

Teams Would Be Subject to Level Three Menu of Penalties Repeatedly Until APR Improves

Menu Options:

- Financial Aid Penalties (any amount, any type).
- Practice Penalties (Reduction of four hours/week and up).
- Contest Reductions (10% up to full season).
- Restricted and Corresponding Membership.
- Coach-Specific Penalties, Including Game Restrictions, Recruiting Restrictions.
- Restricted Access to Practice for Incoming Student-Athletes That Fall Below Pre-Determined Academic Standards.
- Multiyear Postseason Competition Ban.








Two Year Transfer Trending


