RE: FY 26 Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) Analysis Results

Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) is an option under Section104(a) of the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 which ultimately provides an option for a school district to provide free breakfast and lunch to every student. The reimbursement rates as a CEP District are different than our traditional claiming method as a National School Lunch Program (NSLP) District. Additionally, these rates are different based on the percentage of the districts "Identified Students." Below is an abbreviated summary of rates.

Currently our reimbursement rates for NSLP are;

Breakfast: Reduced Rate = \$2.07 and Free Rate = \$2.37
 Lunch: Reduced Rate = \$4.12 and Free = \$4.52

The process of determining the cost or valuation of the CEP program

- 1) Find the number of students as of April 1, 2025 who represent the "Identified Students" for the evaluation. (Note: This is not your Free and Reduced Population.)
- 2) Make preliminary calculations. ISBE provides a spreadsheet to enter enrollments, identified students, and meal counts which will make a comparison calculation based on reimbursement rates. (Note: The spreadsheet takes into consideration an increase in meals factor.) See page #2
- 3) If preliminary calculations and desire of the District is to move forward, then the application process begins.

Analysis Results: See the spreadsheet

Traditional claiming reimbursement = \$828,000
 CEP claiming reimbursement = \$690,000

• Implementation of the CEP program would cost the District approximately \$130,000/year.

As a result of the CEP analysis, District Administration cannot recommend the implementation of CEP at this time. This analysis has been and will continue to be a yearly evaluation.
