Progress

- Individual campuses have consistently reached out to guardians with pending registration files for next school year.
- Enrollment Task Force has held registration drives at various campuses and at central locations throughout out attendance zones
- Offered chromebooks, WiFi hot-spots, and one-on-one assistance for parents to register their students in convenient locations throughout the school district.



Next steps

Returning Students

- Campuses will schedule time before the start of the school year for guardian to register. This will be done by following all CDC and local health guidelines.
- Returning Student Registration- Campuses will continue to provide support for parents with the process of registration in Skyward via in-person or remote.

New Students

- New Student Registration- Curbside registration for new student families that require assistance. Alternatively, guardians will be given the option to send documentation electronically. This will be done by following all CDC and local health guidelines.
- New Student Registration- When all documentation is complete parents will be notified via phone or email and an appointment will be scheduled with the counselor in order to finalize their schedule. Students and parents will have the option of a phone call or google hangout.
