2nd Quarter Growth Report

Bob Templeton, Templeton Demographics provided the Board of Trustees with information concerning the general DFW housing market, economic indicators, Denton I.S.D. residential activity and enrollment projections as of the 1st Quarter 2013 and its impact to the overall growth of Denton ISD. This information will assist the Board of Trustees and district staff in

developing educational programming, attendance zones and placement of future school facilities.

The Dallas-Fort Worth area is currently the second largest in total growth of homes being built and number of building permits issued in the United States. DISD is expected to grow by 3.9 percent over the next five years and surpassing 31,000 students by 2017.

Discussion & Review of Child Nutrition Guidelines-Universal Breakfast Robin Wantland, Director of Child Nutrition provided the Board with information regarding Senate Bill 376 that was signed into law on May 24, 2013. This bill requires Universal Free Breakfast to be served to all students on campuses with 80% or greater low income households. Implementation is required to begin in the 2014-2015 school year. The objectives with the program will be to provide free breakfast meals that are nutritious, popular with students, in compliance with all regulatory guidelines, cost effective, and delivered in a manner that least disrupts regular school operations.

Discussion of 3121 FICA Alternative Plan Update

Karen Almon, Insurance Coordinator provided the Board with additional information they had requested regarding the FICA Alternative plan. The following is additional information:

- Participating employees are not subject to Social Security taxes while covered by this plan, and Social Security taxes are never due on these funds.
- Any benefits previously earned under another retirement plan (including Social Security) will not be reduced by participation in this plan.
- Contributions to this plan are pre-tax. Therefore, the total amount of taxes paid will be reduced. No taxes are paid on the contributions until they are withdrawn.
- Withdrawals from this account may be made in a lump-sum cash payment. (The IRS 10% penalty on early withdrawals does not apply to withdrawals upon separation at age 55 or later.)
- Plan balances may be rolled over to an IRA or other eligible retirement plan. No IRS penalty applies to these transfers.
- The account balance is portable and there are no administrative fees.
