



Region 4 ESC: Safety Audit Report Summary for (School Board)

In **March 2026**, trained safety auditors registered with the Texas School Safety Center conducted an on-site visit of Spring Branch Independent School District instructional and facilities for the security/safety audit. The purpose of this service is to assist the school district in maintaining a proactive approach to safety and security for all students and staff and satisfy the requirement by Senate Bill 11 and *TEC §37.108* for a safety audit once every three years.

The following areas were included in the Region 4 ESC Safety Audit Process:

- Intruder Assessment
- Security Assessment
- Vulnerability Assessment
- Interior of Building
 - Security of Classrooms
 - Electrical Issues
 - Fire Safety
 - First Aid Capacity
 - Cafeteria/Kitchen
 - Chemical Storage
- School Climate and Culture
- Tripping Hazards
- Health and Wellness Factors (AED, Stop the Bleed Kits/Training, CPR/First Aid)
- Grounds and Building Exterior
- Outlying Buildings
- Playground Safety
- Science Labs
- Vocational Education Labs (Auto Tech, Ag, Building Trades, Cosmetology, etc.) (HS only)
- Emergency Operations Plans/Procedures/Drills

A brief review of the findings on each campus was verbally reported to the principal at the conclusion of each site visit. While every effort was taken to conduct a professional and quality summary of findings for each campus without disturbing instruction, there may have been circumstances or situations that resulted in an inadvertent oversight.
