The lesson included students collecting 3 types of snow, reviewing the crystals through a Proscope and Magnifying Glasses, analyzing the time it takes for snow to melt. They learned about vapor condensation, precipitation, rain, snow, sleet, and hail as they created a Cloud in a Jar.
