

2.5 APPROVAL OF AN APPLICATION FOR A SCHOOL MAINTENANCE PROGRAM GRANT

A. SUBJECT

This item is included on the agenda so the Board can approve an application for a School Maintenance Project Grant.

B. INFORMATION

The State of Illinois announced that they are making available funds for the School Maintenance Grant Program. The dollar-for-dollar state matching grant program provides up to \$50,000 in matching funds for the maintenance or upkeep of buildings or structures for educational purposes.

The money from this matching grant allow Woodstock Community Unit School District 200 to complete the following maintenance project:

- Replace the on-grade chiller and associated piping into the building at Mary Endres Elementary School.

This project has an estimated cost of \$495,000. The School Maintenance Grant can award a maximum of \$50,000 and the District would be required to at least match that amount.

C. RECOMMENDATION

The Superintendent recommends approval of an application for a School Maintenance Project Grant application.
