**Keller Coach named Coach of the Year:** Keller Softball Coach Moe Fritz was voted USA Today National Fastpitch Coaches Association Coach of the Year. The NFCA recognizes regional and national coaching excellence in NCAA Divisions I, II and III, NAIA, NJCAA, Cal JC, NWAACC, High School and Travel Ball. All NFCA-member coaches are eligible each season.

## KISD students named in THSCA 2005-06 Class 4A Academic All-State football team:

The Texas High School Coaches Association recently announced the Class 4A and Class 5A Academic All-State Football team for 2005-06. The teams are selected by a scoring system that awards points for GPA, class rank and SAT or ACT score. The students/athletes are then placed on teams according to the number of points they have earned. The Elite team represents the highest point total that can be achieved. Criteria required to be nominated is 1) overall GPA of 92 or above, including grades 9-12 and the first six weeks of grade 12; 2) Be a member of the team in good standing at the time of nomination; 3) Be of good moral character.

The choir participated in two performances of the Disney Candlelight Ceremony on Dec. 3. The Candlelight Ceremony is a mass choir, orchestra concert telling the story of the birth of Jesus. Central High was the only choir chosen from Texas.

The All-State tryout process begins with nearly 20,000 students trying out for approximately 300 positions. All of these musicians are in the top 1 percent of performers from across the state.
